Second deaf and hard of hearing regional office opens in Western Michigan

Deaf and Hard of Hearing Services (DHHS), a 501(c)3 non-profit agency in Grand Rapids, is pleased to announce a second regional office in Muskegon, serving the deaf and hard of hearing population in Muskegon, Ottawa, Oceana and Newaygo, effective October 1, 2009.

Deaf and Hard of Hearing Connection (D/HHC), a program under MOKA Corporation in Muskegon, was relinquished to DHHS after careful consideration so resources could continue uninterrupted in the area.

“We at DHHS look forward to collaborating with community partners in the greater Muskegon area to create programs for deaf and hard of hearing individuals and families,” stated Katie Prins, DHHS’ executive director who is overseeing both regional offices. “Our staff in Muskegon, including Donielle Potts, who joined us from D/HHC as an administrative assistant, has shown great interest in improving services for this regional entity.”

DHHS – Muskegon, as it is now called, is located at 86 Seaway Drive, Muskegon, Michigan, 49444, near Seaway and Hoyt. The DHHS - Muskegon office is currently providing interpreter referral service, American Sign Language classes, workshops and any advocacy matters. DHHS is currently reconstructing its web site to accurately reflect both regional offices and its available services to the community.
